WHO

Young Men's Service League is a mother-son organization dedicated to serving the local community and enhancing mother-son relationships. When starting from the beginning, young men and their mothers participate in a four-year program of philanthropy, education, and leadership. We are currently open to next year's incoming freshmen and sophomores (classes of 2023 and 2024).

PHILANTHROPY

YMSL believes strongly in opportunities that provide human to human contact and interactions—opportunities that value the importance of relationship and community. Each member of YMSL is required to serve at least 20 hours of community service throughout the year.

EDUCATION AND LEADERSHIP

In addition to their service hours, young men are required to attend monthly meetings where they develop leadership skills and learn about a variety of life skills. These typically fall under the umbrella of: social skills, making choices, health/nutrition, and life/practical skills. Moms attend a few of our own meetings, mostly dedicated to chapter operations, but we have plenty of fun as well!

DUES

Dues typically range between \$150 - \$200 for the year, and include the application fee, chapter insurance, website, boys' t-shirt(s), and annual banquet.

COMMITMENT

Outside of attending a minimum number of meetings (both moms and sons), each is expected to hold a position within the organization, which can range from a one-time commitment to a year-long responsibility.
